Rev. Grumbles is a Congregational Teacher serving at Albany Baptist Church, Albany, NY, where he is a prospective pastor. He met his wife, Helen, at Virginia Tech and they have three children: Owen (12), Clara (11), and Simeon (10 mo. old). Drew has

served in pastoral ministry for about ten years. He received his M.Div. and Ph.D. (in Old Testament) from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, in North Carolina.

Rev. Grumbles will also teach a special session of our **Adult Sunday School Class** on the topic of **Prayer**, in the Fireside Room, taking time to answer your questions on prayer.

Sunday night is our annual "Concert of Prayer" at 6:00 PM — an orchestrated sixty minutes of praying!

Monday through Friday we have four prayer meetings led by an Elder; all are in-person meetings, with one also to be shared on *ZOOM*.

These meetings will begin with a brief devotional message from God's Word then our requests are shared, and conversational praying begins. (Note: praying aloud is our practice, but it is never required of anyone attending any meeting).

May the Lord again open our eyes to the power, privilege and potential of prayer at CPCC throughout our "Prayer Week 2023."
