Before pastoral ministry at Windsor, Ben worked for the Navigators, and then attended seminary at Gordon-Conwell. He is also an instructor with the Simeon Trust, and led the workshop at CPCC in 2018, where he and Pastor Bissett met. They've since become friends and led a Simeon Trust workshop together in Indianapolis in early 2023.

Pastor O'Toole will also teach a special session of our **Adult Sunday School Class** on the topic of **Prayer** in the Fireside Room, taking time to answer your questions on prayer.

Sunday night Pastor Bissett will lead our annual "Concert of Prayer" at 6:00 PM — reading Scriptures and then lead several brief "segments" or "movements" of prayer, orchestrated around various themes.

Monday & Wednesday we have evening prayer meetings. These will begin with a brief devotional message from God's Word, then our requests are shared, and conversational praying begins. (Note: praying aloud is our practice, but it is never required of anyone attending any meeting).

May the Lord again open our eyes to the power, privilege and potential of prayer at CPCC throughout our "Prayer Week 2024."
